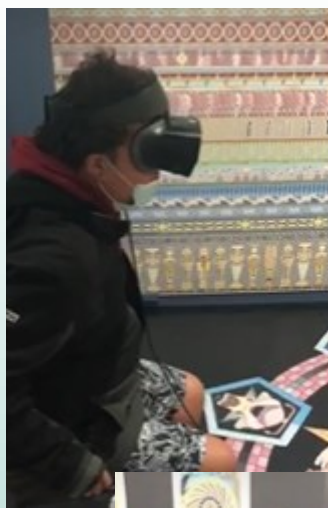
Paula recently took the time to check it out, and in her words "it was lots of fun - it was like walking through a maze with lots of surprises along the way. I can't wait to have another go".

Must be time to put the kettle on Deena!

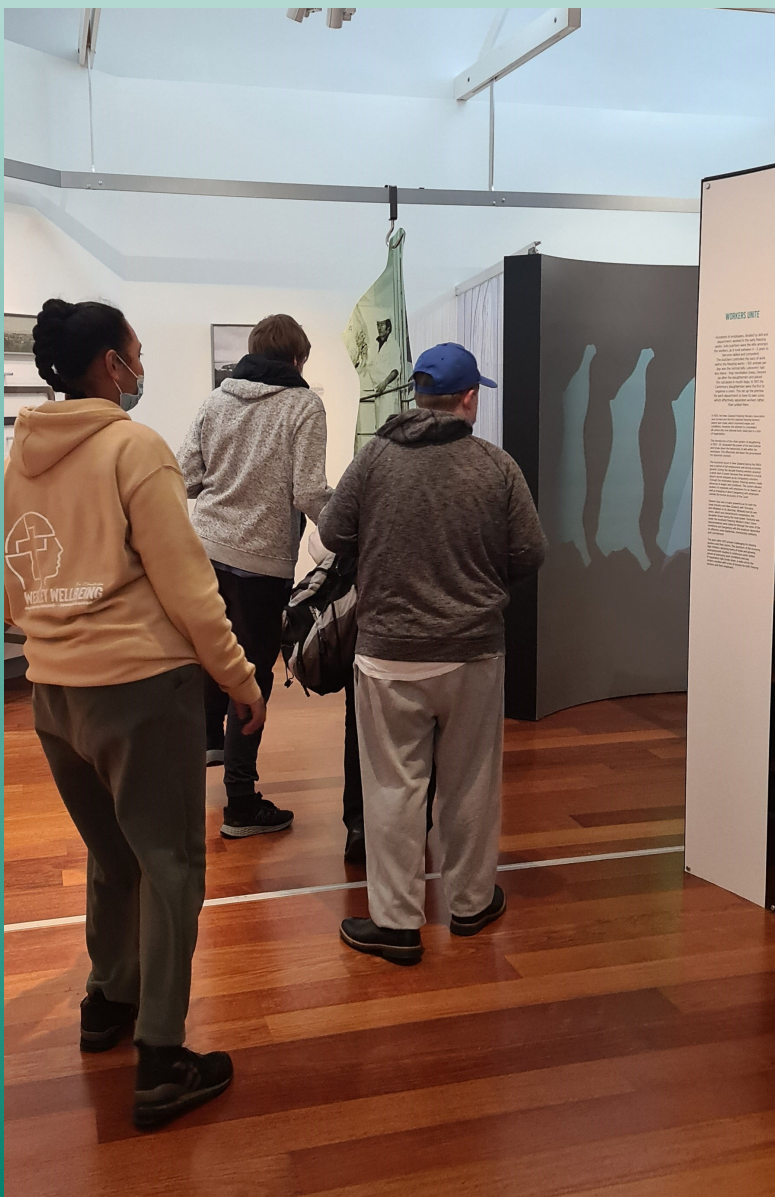


Sometimes we like to go somewhere different to see and experience some new things.

Pathways Awarua has lots of different programmes on offer including general numeracy, general reading, general writing, listening, number facts, my money, health and safety and my community. The road code is a popular pathway which has been developed in collaboration with NZTA to help adults and young adults prepare for their learner and restricted driver licences, while at the same time strengthening their literacy and numeracy.

Keep up the great work!

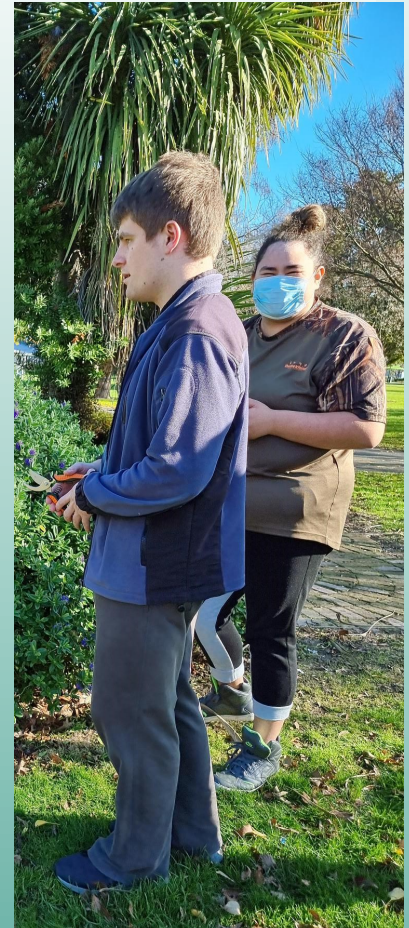
